C., nurse consultant with the United States public health service, reviewed the latest program of social hygiene being conducted by the governmental department, at a public meeting conducted at the University school as a feature of the three-day convention of the Montana Nurses' Association, which opened here today.

Speaking at the National Association of the Social Hygiene Program, Miss Bean, the featured speaker of the first annual convention of the state group, told a large number of interested delegates and nurses present that the public health service is carrying on a broad program designed to control venereal diseases and bring before the public the dangerous facts that have been covered by the lack of knowledge concerning the epidemic.

**Notes Published**

Education of the public is essential in the fight against venereal diseases and their effects on an important part of the program being stressed, according to the nurse consultant, who said that the social hygiene program must be brought out of the darkness and placed where it will be public attention of the program as a means of preventing further infection.
